

What are the benefits of taking a Career Assessments?

- Allows you to evaluate who you are as an individual.
- Guides you in determining what you hope to put into a career and what you desire to get out of it.
- Gain information to help you narrow your interests and identify an area to work in.
- Assists you in making a decision between multiple job offers.
- Identify a clear understanding of your personal values so you will be able to effectively convey that information to a potential employer and use it to assist you in your decision making process.
- Familiarize you with both your strengths and weaknesses, allowing you to articulate the unique characteristics that set you apart from others applying for the same job.

Where can I take a Career Assessments?

Each college on campus has Career Consultants who will meet with you to discuss your interests and explore career opportunities available to you. You will find them located in your college's Career Services office. In addition, Career Consultants are available in the office of OSU Career Services, 360 Student Union. Career Assessments available through OSU Career Services include Do What You Are, Kuder StrengthsQuest, Strong Interest Inventory, and Meyers-Briggs Type Indicator.

 - The Myers-Briggs Type Indicator is a personality assessment that categories behavior based on interest preferences in a leisure and work setting.
